


Prayer Before Reading Scripture






- "Hebrew" Jews

The Masoretic Hebrew Bible



- Oldest extant manuscript dates to 1000 AD
- Masoretic text finalized
 7-19th c.
- But the text tradition predates Christ (as evidenced by Dead Sea Scrolls)

Aramaic Portions of Hebrew Bible

- Daniel 2:4b-7:28 (200 verses)
- Ezra 4:8–6:18, 7:12-26 (67 verses)
- Jeremiah 10:11

The Targums (Aramaic Bible)

- Targum: translation or interpretation
 - Targum Onkelos (aka Babylonian)
 - Targum Jonathan
 - Targum Yerushalmi
- New Testament writers sometimes quoted from Targumim

Aramaic Targum Quotes in NT

- Deuteronomy 32:35
 - Heb: Vengeance is mine, and recompense
 - LXX: In the day of vengeance I will repay
 - Targum (Aramaic paraphrase): Vengeance is mine, I will repay
- Targum version quoted in
 - Rom 12.19
 - Heb 10:30

The Septuagint (LXX)

- Greek translation of the Old Testament
- Contains Deuterocanonical Books
- The LXX is important because it...
 - Was the OT version quoted by NT Authors
 - Was the OT version of the early church
 - Is the OT version still used by the Orthodox Church
- Sometimes differs from the masoretic Hebrew text

The Divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures

- The Law (Torah)
 - Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy
- The Prophets (Nevi'im)
 - Joshua, Judges, Samuel and Kings; Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the Twelve Minor Prophets.
- The Writings (Ketuvim)
 - Psalms, Proverbs, Job; Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, Esther; Daniel, Ezra-Nehemiah, Chronicles

Luke 24:44

God Spoke with Multiple Meanings

- Literal meaning
 - Use the historical, cultural, and literary context to determine what the author meant and how the listener would have interpreted it.
- Secondary meaning
 - Future fulfillment
 - Fulfilled in the life of the Messiah
 - Allegorical
 - People, animals, objects, events interpreted as representing something else.
 - Typological
 - People, events, etc. interpreted as as types pre-figuring events or aspects of Christ or his revelation described in the New Testament.
