
Watch John 1:35-51

Study John 1:35-51

John 1.35-37 The next day John was standing there again with two of his disciples, when he saw Jesus walking by. "There is the Lamb of God!" he said. The two disciples heard him say this and went with Jesus. (GNB)

John 1.35-37 The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples; and he looked at Jesus as he walked, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. (RSV)

p. 25 "The two disciples heard their teacher bearing testimony about Jesus and immediately followed Jesus. What brevity, such simplicity, and what depth! The Baptist spoke with his voice, with his eyes, and with his heart. No one can fully describe the emotional condition of both the disciples and their teacher. The great prophet beholds the beloved. The common thirst for the Messiah, for grace and truth, allows the teacher to let go of his disciples that they may follow Christ. And the disciples left their teacher and followed Christ without asking for some explanation. The faith of the great prophet impelled them toward Christ, and the divine grace of Christ attracted them to him."

John 1.38-39 Jesus turned, saw them following him, and asked, "What are you looking for?" They answered, "Where do you live, Rabbi?" (This word means "Teacher.") "Come and see," he answered. (It was then about four o'clock in the afternoon.) So they went with him and saw where he lived, and spent the rest of that day with him. (GNB)

John 1.38-39 Jesus turned, and saw them following, and said to them, "What do you seek?" And they said to him, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying; and they stayed with him that day, for it was about the tenth hour. (RSV)

- 2. "Where do you live?" vs "Where are you staying?"
- 3. What was a Rabbi in Jesus' time?
- 4. What is the significance of "Come and see" and "stayed"?

John 1.40-42 One of the two who heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which means Christ). He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him, and said, "So you are Simon the son of John? You shall be called Cephas" (which means Peter). (GNB)

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- 1. What does it mean "He *first* found...."?
- 2. How is what Andrew did a pattern for all Christians?
- 3. What is the significance of Jesus' renaming Simon? (See Gen 17.5; 32.28)

John 1.43-46 The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Come with me!" (Philip was from Bethsaida, the town where Andrew and Peter lived.) Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one whom Moses wrote about in the book of the Law and whom the prophets also wrote about. He is Jesus son of Joseph, from Nazareth." "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," answered Philip. (GNB)



John 1.47-50 When Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, he said about him, "Here is a real Israelite; there is nothing false in him!" Nathanael asked him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered, "I saw you when you were under the fig tree before Philip called you." "Teacher," answered Nathanael, "you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus said, "Do you believe just because I told you I saw you when you were under the fig tree? You will see much greater things than this!" (GNB)

- 2. Why did Nathaniel to conclude Jesus is the Messiah?

Zechariah 3.8-10

Hear now, O Joshua the high priest, you and your friends who sit before you, for they are men of good omen: behold, I will bring my servant the Branch. For behold, upon the stone which I have set before Joshua, upon a single stone with seven facets, I will engrave its inscription, says the LORD of hosts, and I will remove the guilt of this land in a single day.
